

Tutorial bandana bib, booties and mittens

Print the document in actual size. There are marked cut lines that should align against each other so that the pattern lines meet when you tape together.

Start with the booties, you will need to cut out all the pieces pictured. Main fabric, lining and cuffs.



Start with sewing the heel together. Then add markings to center front and back on both sole and foot.



Sew the sole to the foot.



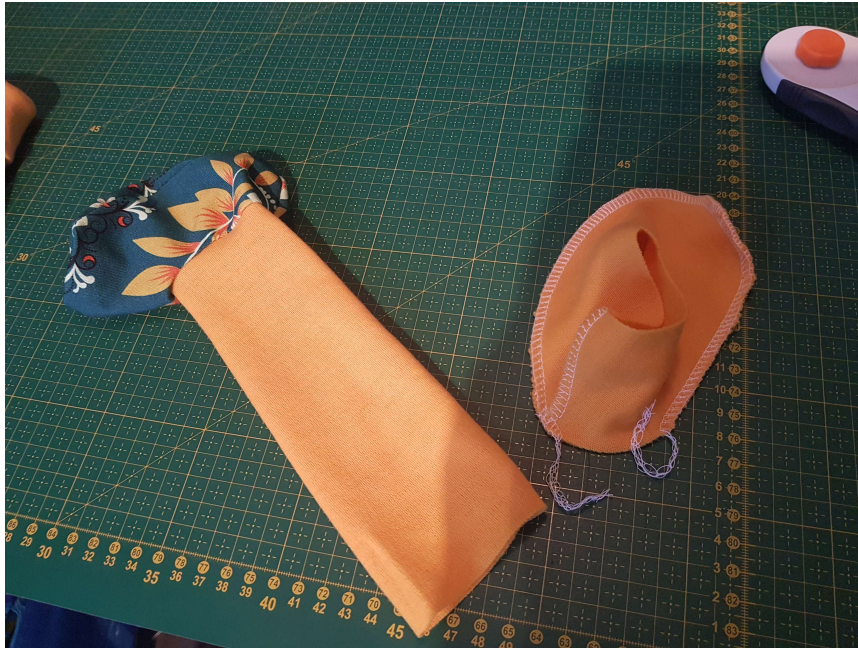
Do the same with the lining, but leave a little opening so you can turn it right side out afterwards.
Fold the cuffs in half and sew the long side together.



Put the cuff inside the main fabric, right sides together and sew.



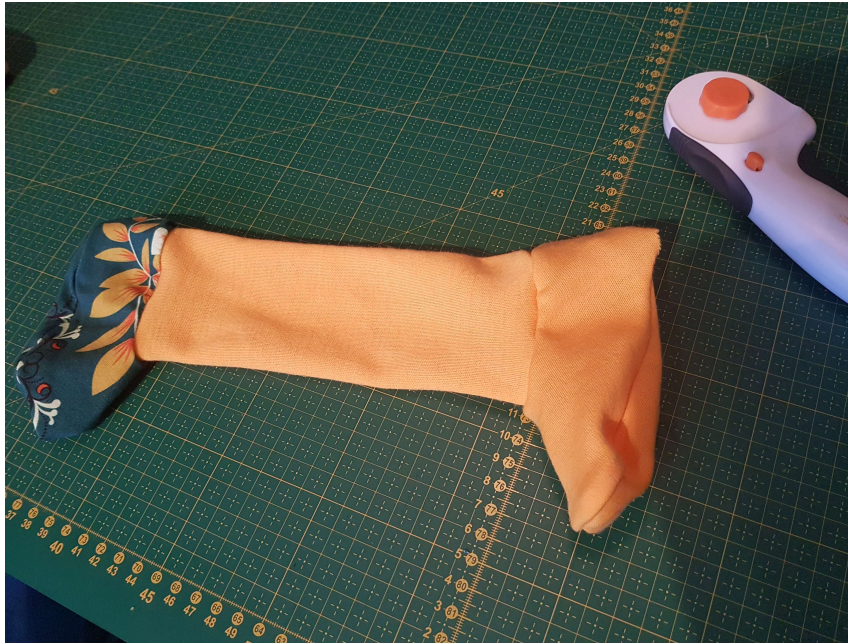
Turn the main part right side out and then put it and the cuff inside the lining, right sides together and sew in place.



It should now look something like this (image below).



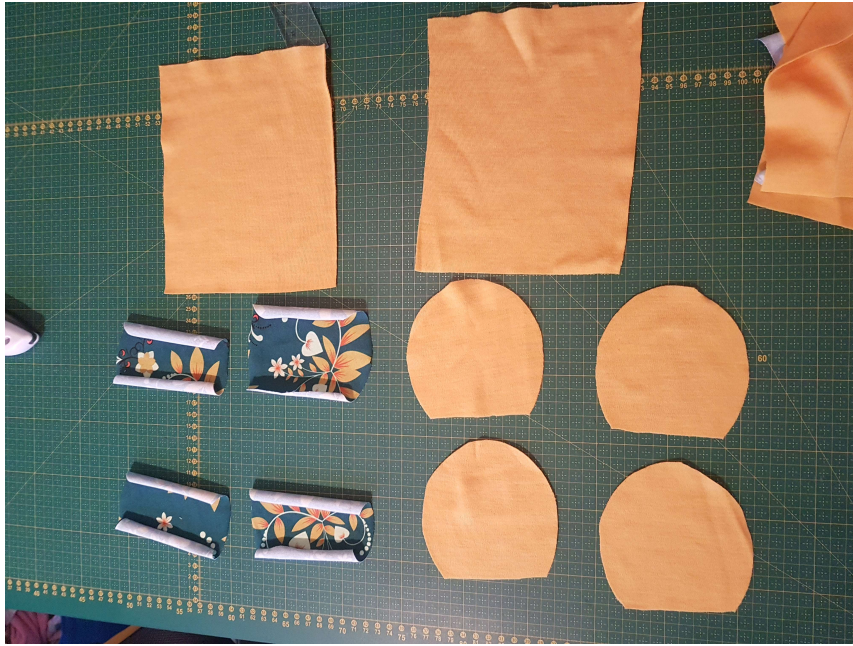
Turn the entire bootie right side out through the opening you left.



Put the lining inside the main, fold down the cuff and it should now look like this. Make another one the same way.



For the mittens you need the following parts.



Sew one side of the lining together, repeat with the outer fabric. Then put one outer and one lining set on each side of the cuff (right sides together) and sew together on the short (straight) side.



Should look like this when done.



Fold in half, right sides together and sew around, but leave a little turning hole.



Turn it right side out through the hole and sew it together.



Put the lining inside the outer, fold the cuff and repeat all steps for the other mitten.



For the bandana bib you only need 2 parts (and maybe some interfacing for the buttons). You can turn and top stitch, but it is meant to have a raw edge. If you want, pin the front to the back (wrong sides together) but I usually just start in one corner and sew all the way around without pinning.



The result should look like this. Place the buttons where you prefer, place two on one side if you want it to fit longer.
